GVISH at a Glance

The current academic year 2025 – 26 is a landmark in the history of GVISH, Amravati, as the institute has successfully completed more than 100 years of glorious, unparalleled service to the Nation in innovations, research and excellence in teaching and learning. More than 100 years of meaningful existence added values to the lives of the people across the country. With the Autonomy conferred by the UGC from the academic year 2021-2022, a new era of education has started in GVISH, Amravati.

It is worth mentioning that the college established in 1923 was Christend as ‘King Edward College’ in the historical city of Amravati, in Vidarbha which is known for its natural beauty, cash crops like Orange, Cotton, a rich cultural and mythological heritage. The King Edward College was renamed later as Vidarbha Mahavidyalaya (VMV) in the Post-Independent period. In 2001, the Govt. of Maharashtra had elevated this college into an Institute as it is one of the oldest and most reputed Institutions in the country. Now it has become an Autonomous Institute of Science and Humanities (Autonomous)

Today GVISH is a Premier Educational Institute in the Vidarbha region of Maharashtra State, imparting quality education and innovative research. The Institute has etched a mark in academic and co-curricular activities with outstanding results. The Institute has achieved many milestones in its journey of 100 years. From the academic year 2023 – 24 the Institute has been offering NEP pattern at UG and PG level. The new syllabi of academic programmes are set to boost, physical, mental, social, emotional, and intellectual development of the students. This will be a student – centric approach wherein students will have freedom to choose the subjects to explore their insatiable desire for knowledge.

In 1923 when the college started, only 30 students were enrolled and today around four thousand students are studying per academic year. The Silver Jubilee of the Institute was celebrated in 1948 – 49, the golden Jubilee in 1972 – 73, the Diamond Jubilee in 1984 – 85 and Amrut Mahotsava in 1998-99. . In its journey of more than 100 years, the college has molded millions of scholars who are serving in the country and abroad as well.

Glorious past

The contribution of the Institute has been well reflected in the writings of several writers like Vishram Bedekar who in his autobiography ‘Ek Zaad Don Pakshi’ (One Tree Two Birds) has immortalized it. Several novelists, poets and eminent personalities including Suresh Bhat, Ram Shwealkar, Madhukar Keche, Vithal Wagh, Sudhakar Rao Naik (Former Chief Minister of Maharashtra)

have etched their everlasting memories in golden letter. Vijay Bhatkar, the great Indian Computer Scientist, internationally acclaimed, a former student of VMV was instrumental in developing the super computer PARAM. Large number of former students have found a place in administrative, cultural and social service sectors in government as well as private sectors. From this fertile ground of this institute, many veterans have come up to lead in various fields – social, political, sports, administration, teaching in India and abroad. Most importantly, some are still contributing to the growth and progress of this country in their respective domains.

This Institute has been making continuous efforts to enlighten the people of Maharashtra in general and Vidarbha in particular. Today this institute is at the forefront of Government Educational Institutions in Maharashtra with its focus on sustainable educational development and quality. It is a matter of pride for all of us that the Bangalore based National Assessment and Accreditation Committee (NAAC) has rated the institute with an ‘A’ grade with CGPA 3.32.

Academic Arena

The institute provides 19 PG courses and 22 UG courses. Along with that it has the facility for research studies in 21 Subjects under different faculties –languages and literature, culture, Sciences, Social Sciences, Home Sciences and Physical Education. Sant Gadge Baba University, Amravati has recognized the Institute as premier Research Center. Today more than 240 of Researchers / practitioners are on roll in their pursuit of knowledge. Moreover, the competitive examination guidance center has started, functioning from 2021 – 22. Another prestigious establishment includes Pre-IAS coaching center.

Panoramic View

The institute is spread majestically on the 168 acres campus with closed fence, greenery well- constructed buildings and a magnificent orchard. The natural environment makes the education more pleasant. The lush green campus provides shade and healthy atmosphere for students and also attracts the people of the vicinity. The main building is an epitome of gothic architecture and worth to be included in the world Heritage list. The special attraction of the students is the majestic “Apsara Garden’ in front of the main building. Each teaching Department has its own well planned and designed building. The Administrative Block, Examination Cell and mathematics Department: function in the main building. Home Science, Music (with a Majalis Hall) Zoology, Botany, Statistics, Physics, Chemistry all departments have separate buildings. Physical Education has Sports Complex with a separate Yoga Bhavan. Geography and Social Sciences have a separate building and there is a big spacious separate building for Bhasha Bhavan for the study and research

of Indian and Western languages, including Literature and Cultures are of the high lights. The Central Library with a collection of millions of books, some rare periodicals, rare manuscripts seek the attention of each and every researcher. Cricket Pavilion (under Construction) and stadium are other features. Three Auditoriums, Two LCD Digital big screens, Digital rooms, ICT classrooms, Language lab, Computer rooms are in the campus. The institute has two units each of NCC and NSS for the overall development of students. Institute has its own firing range, Placement cell and women cell. The Staff Accommodation is also available for the Director, teaching faculties and non – teaching staff. Post office, water supply department and police station are in the campus. There are well equipped two hostels for boys and three for girls,-which is a blessing for students from nearby places.

The distinct characteristic of the Institute is that all the professors are recruited through Maharashtra public Service Commission (MPSC) based on merit. For the Department of Statistics, Zoology and Botany, the Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India has allotted some special funds. The Institute regularly organizes National, International Conferences, Seminars and Workshops. Avishkar competitions with the funding/collaboration of the department of Human Resources Development, University Grants Commission, Indian Council of Social Sciences Research (ICSSR) and other Institutes and Universities, DST and other sponsoring organizations is arranged throughout the year. Some professors have obtained patents for their research under intellectual property rights, many others have gone abroad for presenting research papers. Some professors are working abroad as visiting faculties and specialized scholars in various universities, while others are trying to make mark on the Literary horizon of Maharashtra with their creative writings. The institute has signed MoU with other universities and institutes abroad and reputed Government bodies and NGO in India as well.

Garden

Govt. Vidarbha Institute of Science and Humanities harbors three lush green gardens. Institute's entrance is flanked by beautiful Apsara garden with seasonal delicacies of wide range of flowers. Admission Policy and Process

Admission Policy

- Admissions in the Autonomous Degree Courses will be on the basis of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination or its equivalent, for both the Undergraduate (UG) and the Postgraduate (PG) courses, unless specified otherwise.
- For admissions to PG courses of Science stream (Zoology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Statistics), 60% weightage will be given to Entrance Test (multiple choice question paper) and 40% weightage to B.Sc. aggregate marks.
- All applications for admissions to any UG or PG degree courses should be submitted before the last date notified by the Institute. Late applications will not be accepted.
- Admissions will be considered to be completed only when the full fees for the academic year are paid (against an official receipt) and the name of the applicant appears on the relevant rolls.
- All UG and PG admissions are valid only for one year and are therefore to be renewed for each subsequent year of study.
- Admission to Grant-in-aid and non-grant seats will be purely on merit basis to PG courses of Science stream (Zoology, Botany, Chemistry and Physics)
- Students once admitted to non-grant seats will not be converted to grant-in-aid seats. It should be noted that the fees paid for non-grant seats will not be refunded in any condition.
- In case of cancellation of admission to UG and PG courses, there will not be reimbursement of tuition fees. Laboratory fees will be refunded only within eight days from the date of admission.
- Students seeking admission directly to second year UG or PG courses in the Institute need to produce equivalence certificate issued by the Institute's Equivalence Committee.

General Rules for The Fees

Donation, Bribe, Gifts, etc. are not allowed in the Institute. If anybody demand for money other than fees the matter should be brought to the notice of the director and admission committee immediately.

All admission transaction are cash less.

1. No fees charged for the students belonging to S. C., S.T., Vimukata, Nomadic Tribe. (As per G. R. dated 9 August 2004) at the time of admission. But once the scholarship is disbursed in their account by the government, they are supposed to pay the requisite fees in the office.
2. Economically backward class students can get the benefit of free education scheme. They have to apply in the proper format within one month after admission. (The form for Rs. 1/- is available in the office).
3. If any damage is done to the institute building, library and hostel by a student. The recovery amount will be deducted from the deposit amount. To get the deposit a student has to apply for the same within three years with demand application of the parents.
4. A student has to retain the receipt of amount paid. In case the receipt is lost, they can be given payment certificate on paying Rs.25/-
5. A student has to collect identity card from the office. If the original ID card is lost, a duplicate identity card will issued for Rs. 50/-.
6. The fees paid at the time of admission in the Institute or hostel will not be refunded on any ground

Rules and Regulations

Government Vidarbha Institute of Science and Humanities Amravati is a government institute. All the property in this institute belong to the government of Maharashtra and any damage to this property is a legal crime. As the Director, teaching staff and employees of this Institute perform government duties, causing any interruption in their work is also a crime. Hence it is compulsory for every student to follow the rules of discipline.

1. Students should abide by the rules and regulations of the Institute. The Institute authority may take disciplinary action if any student violates the Institute norms.
2. Students admitted in this college must read the prospectus carefully and follow the mentioned guidelines.
3. Behavior of every student with teachers, employees and other students in the campus & at the Hostel should be civilized.
4. It is mandatory for admitted students to be in uniform and carry an identity card while at the premises.
5. Pasting the bills and writing any matter on the walls of buildings within premises of the institute is strictly prohibited. Such an act will lead to strict disciplinary action.
6. Photography, without prior permission of the director of the institute, is not allowed within the premises.
7. As per the government orders smoking and spitting is strictly prohibited. Everyone should use dust bins to keep the premises clean and beautiful. Littering the campus by plastic, papers, garbage or any other means is strictly prohibited.
8. The students are not allowed to raise any kind of funds without prior permission of the Director of the institute. The students are not allowed to invite any outside person, when organizing a programme, without prior permission of the Director of the institute. The students, especially the hostel students, are not allowed to organize any meeting, conference and religious program without prior permission and similarly are not allowed to establish any organization.
9. Grievance redressal -A)The grievance redressal cell will have all the rights for disciplinary action against the students if they have conflicts or quarrels among them or if the committee receives any complaint in this regard.
10. Internal complaint committee (ICC) - main objective of this committee is to resolve the complaints and difficulties chiefly of women and implementation thereby. For this reason internal complaint committee has been organized.
11. The Director reserves the right to unroll the student from institute for following reasons:
 - A) For not paying educational, hostel or other fees.
 - B) Continuous absence for 1 week without substantial reason.
 - C) Unsatisfactory behavior.
 - D) Violation of rules of discipline.

12. Punctuality and attendance in theory and Practical Classes is mandatory for all students.
13. 75% class-attendance is the criteria for eligibility Institutional Examinations.
14. Attendance in the all test mandatory. Absence from Examination without valid reason would be treated as violation of Institute norms. The College authority may take strict action in this regard.
15. It is required that all fees should be paid in due time.
16. Students with irregular attendance in classes and examination, and poor academic performance, will be considered ineligible for examinations.
17. It is the duty of every student to check the notice board & Institute website every day.
18. All formalities & forms regarding Examinations, Result, Enrollment Scholarship etc. should be submitted as per the scheduled date announced by the office.
19. A Student participating in a team or in a sport event will be considered absent, if he/she has not taken prior permission from the director.
20. Ragging is strictly prohibited as per 1999 Maharashtra Law No. 33. The guilty will be imprisoned for two years as Rs. 10000/- will be the fine.
21. The Director reserves the right for any change or inclusion of new rules in the prospectus. Any such change or inclusion is mandatory to the student.

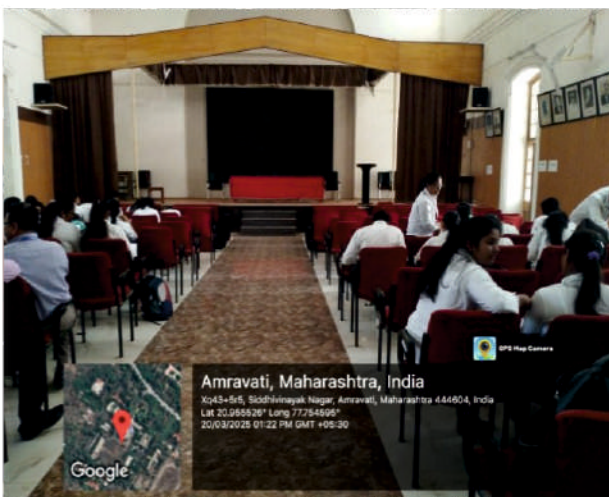

Matoshree Girls & Boys Hostels

The institute provides hostel facility to both girls and boys. The hostel facility is granted to the students of the institute strictly on the basis of merit. The Institute has in all total Five Hostels out of which Two Boys' Hostels each of which can accommodate 100 students, and Two Girls' Hostels with 104 and 48 students' capacities, as well as One Minority Hostel with 100 Girls students' capacity.

- Application form for admission to hostel is to be submitted in the prescribed format into the office. Hostel Admission is available for only 11th, 12th, UG and PG students those who have registered or taken admission in the institute as regular students.
- The seats in the hostels are limited, so final admission in the Institute is not the guarantee of admission in the Hostel. Admission in the Hostel is given only for one academic year. For readmission a new application has to be submitted within ten days after the declaration of the result and he or she will be admitted if he or she scores good marks and his or her name is in the Hostel merit list.
- Students who have availed of the hostel facility previously on the Institute Campus, for Master or Bachelor Degree, shall not be eligible to hostel facility after seeking admission to another Master/Bachelor Degree respectively.
- The reservation of seats in all other four Hostels of the institute except minority hostel is as per Government Resolution.
- The reservation quota for minority girls' hostel is as follow-
1) Muslim - 35% 2) Bauddha - 21% 3) Christian - 6% 4) Jain - 6% 5) Shikh - 1% 6) Parsi - 1% 7) GVISH Amravati - 30%
- If seats in the hostel from one category remain vacant, other category students will be admitted.
- If a student remains absent from the hostel for more than 30 days without the intimation to the rector/superintendent he or she will be expelled from the hostels.
- After finalizing admission in the hostel the student has to come to stay in the hostel otherwise, admission in the hostel will stand cancelled. All fees will have to be paid.
- If anyone does not follow the rules or misbehave his or her admission will be cancelled immediately.
- The students admitted in the Institute for second postgraduate degree are not eligible for the admission in the hostels.
- Hostel will open at the beginning of academic year of the Institute and will be closed at the end of academic year.
- The hostels remain closed in vacations.

All the hostels in the institute are under the CCTV Surveillances with 24/7 Security Guards, Biometric attendance, Suggestion Box, Alarm Button and all the basic facilities

Hostel Fees

Hostels fees are fixed as per GR NO. OrgrEM/1092-(99)/{d/e-5, 37a} 2012. 1992 for all four hostel (except minority girls hostel). If there is any increase in hostel fees by government then it will be mandatory.

1. The above fees are yearly and to be paid in office as once. No concession is given.
2. Rs. 1000/- is to be deposited as security amount for damage in office. This security deposit will not be spent for any programme. At the end of the year after calculation, the remaining amount will be refunded.

Rules For The Hostels

Rules for the Hostels (Code of Conduct) :

1. Students are not allowed to stay out after 7.00 PM without prior permission of the authority.
2. If a student is absent for more than 15 consecutive days or has less than 75% attendance without the prior permission of the Superintendent, his/her admission to the hostel shall be cancelled or re-admission will not be granted.
3. It shall be compulsory for the hostel student to submit the attendance report of the department in the institute in every session.
4. Every student shall be responsible for the hostel furniture, equipment and materials in his room. In case of destruction of the material, the student will be charged a fee equal to its value.
5. Any misbehaviour/indiscreet behaviour of a student in the hostel which may cause trouble to other students will result in immediate cancellation of his/her admission from the hostel.
6. Students shall not indulge in any violent, destructive, damaging, harmful as such behaviour which is detrimental in the law and order and/or against the Government. Students shall not carry on any propaganda or publicity of any nature whatsoever in respect of anything or any matter including unfair matters. Students from one hostel are not allowed to enter in the premises/building of the other hostel on routine basis except under unavoidable circumstances. Students shall not indulge in practices/activities, which may endanger their own personal safety as well as that of others.
7. A student shall not change his/her own room and shall not interchange the materials of the room without the prior permission of the Superintendent.
8. It is obligatory for a student to bring his or her parents or guardians at the time of admission.
9. No religious program, meeting or organization can be established without the prior permission of the Director and any celebration, dance, meeting etc. is strictly prohibited in the hostel without prior written permission.
10. Ragging is a serious offence. According to the Prevention of Ragging Act, strict action will be taken against the student who indulges in ragging.
11. In case of any accident or emergency in the hostel, it must immediately be informed to Security Guard and then to the Superintendent.
12. Complaint regarding any matter in hostel is to be reported/informed to the Superintendent. The Superintendent's decision will be final in the matter of hostel.
13. Electric appliances, irons, heaters, stoves, electric gadgets, tape recorders, speakers, etc. and cooking in the room is strictly prohibited.
14. Vehicles are not permitted inside the hostel however; the students can park their vehicles outside the hostel at the given place on their own risk.
15. Students shall be responsible for maintenance of the hostel property in their occupancy. They shall not disfigure walls, doors and furniture in any way, including driving in nails or sticking/drawing pictures on them. If any damage is noticed, walls, doors or furniture, as the case may be, will be repainted/polished and the expenses for the same will be recovered from the students. If any common property is damaged or lost, the same shall be charged in equal shares to the students who are in common use of that property.
16. Students have to observe discipline in the hostel and ensure that no wasteful or improper use is made of water, electricity, toilet facilities and any other amenities.
17. Students shall not keep any valuable articles, ornaments or cash in their rooms. If they do so, it will be entirely at their own risk. Students shall not leave their rooms unlocked or unattended.
18. Ladies' students are not allowed to enter the Gents Hostels and the Gents students are not allowed to enter the Ladies Hostel.
19. Unauthorized campaigns/events which disturb the discipline of the hostel are not allowed in the hostel premises. Sticking of public posters/pamphlets/brochures/circulars/photographs are not permissible within the hostel campus.
20. If a hostel student needs to go out for some minor work, he will have to make a note in the hostel register.
21. In case of any unethical, indecent, illegal behaviour by a student inside or outside the hostel, the admission of such student will be cancelled immediately, strict action will be taken against the culprits.
22. Entry of any unauthorized person other than the admitted student into the hostel, hostel premises is strictly prohibited. If any unauthorized person is found in any hostel room or premises, strict action will be taken against the concerned student and that person.
23. Students should not indulge in any addiction in the hostel. If anyone is found guilty of drinking alcohol, gambling, smoking and consuming drugs, the admission of the concerned student will be cancelled and police action will be taken against him. All the students are strictly being informed Not to bring and/or consume alcoholic and narcotic products or any other prohibited substance.

24. A student shall be liable for the disciplinary action for wilful disobedience or defiance of authority, for non-observance or frequent violation of any of the conduct rules or hostel rules and regulations, for indulging in undesirable activities such as ragging, physical assault, etc. or for indulging in anti-national or violent, destructive, damaging, harmful activities causing damage to person or property or for committing any act of indiscipline or misconduct.
25. Students should always take care to keep their rooms and hostel premises neat and clean and maintain peace in the hostel.
26. If a student wants to leave the hostel, he or she must seek the permission of the Superintendent.
27. The students cannot leave the hostels without the permission of the Superintendent on the working days of the Institute.
28. If someone falls sick, he or she has to report immediately to the Superintendent. A student can get treatment from outside medical practitioner on their own, it has to be informed in writing to the Superintendent.
29. A student has to give a list of guests allowed to visit by taking signature of parents on it. Names mentioned on the list only are allowed to visit at given time only or on special occasions. Without the parents or guardians' written permission and Superintendent's knowledge No girl students will allow to stay outside or nobody is allowed to see/meet them in hostel corridors.
30. If a student in the hostel wants to go to relatives in the city, the relative has to take responsibility to take him/her and then to bring him/her back to the hostel. In this case, the relative shall have to give a written application with valid reasons as well as his/her valid identity documents to the Superintendent.
31. A student who goes to parents while coming back to hostel he/she has to bring a letter from the parents.
32. If parents are informed in writing by the authority, it is the responsibility of parents to meet the Superintendent immediately, if they fail to do so, they will be responsible for the consequences.
33. Students in hostel are not allowed to participate in meetings or religious programmes without written permission from the Director of the Institute. The students are not allowed to form any organization.
34. From these rules authority has the right to formulate new rules and they will be obligatory to all the students.
35. If admission in the Institute is cancelled, it automatically gets cancelled the hostel admission. If anyone gets admission in other government hostel, he/she has to inform the Superintendent, then the admission in this hostel will have to get cancelled.
36. Outsiders are not allowed to stay in hostels. If found, strict action shall be taken against guilty.
37. Students in the hostel will have to show or produce their identity cards and Admission Receipt upon being asked or enquired by the competent authorities; Director, Superintendent, Registrar, Security Committee Member, Hostel Committee Member, as well as Competent Officer.
38. It is mandatory for all the students in the hostel to strictly follow the rules laid down by the Hon'ble Director, Superintendent from time to time, as well as the rules in the information booklet of the institution.
39. All the admitted students in the hostel will be bound to follow all the above rules.
40. The interpretation of these Regulations by the Hon'ble Director of the institute shall be final and binding on all concerned.

Institute as a Social Responsibility

The institute shoulders the responsibility of making the students aware of plastic free campus. For this purpose a dedicated team of student volunteers are raised to eradicate plastic from the campus and make it more cleaner, greener and healthier. The institute caters another social responsibility by organizing workshop on making eco friendly Ganesh Idol by using clay paper mache, natural colours which are also displayed for sale. This is in collaboration with an NGO Wildlife and Environment Conservation Society Amravati. Another social feature of the institute is organizing workshops on preparation of natural Holi colours which are herbal in nature. The institute also organizes free of cost hemoglobin and blood group detection camps regularly in downtrodden ruler villages. Bird conservation and making provision of food and water for birds in dry summer months is another outstanding activity carried out in the institute. Health checkup camps for students and staff are also conducted regularly by the institute. Organization of covid vaccination camp during the Covid pandemic for students and staff is another social feature of the institute. Apart from these various other social programs are organized like "Scientific and rational programs" for inculcating scientific attitude in students, "Cyber crime" for making student cyber literate.

Linkages

GVISH - ISRO Linkage : ISRO linkage is bridge between the students and scientists. Its main aim is to introduce the students to different fields of research related to space research. This linkage updates the students about the different facilities available, programs conducted at ISRO and job opportunities.

GVISH-ZSI Linkage : Zoological Survey of India linkage helps in undertaking Academic projects, assignments for student

GVISH-WECS Linkage : Under the banner of wildlife and environment conservation society linkage, various environmental related programs are conducted for biodiversity and environment conservation.

GVISH-DOVE Linkage : DOVE (Garment Industry) linkage in motivating students to develop entrepreneurial skills in textile field.

GVISH-Horticulture College Linkage : This linkage helps in organizing workshop on development of kitchen garden and related guest lectures for student.

Disciplinary Rules and Regulation

- Students are to contribute to the high standard of the college by their manners and general good behavior.
- For the smooth running of the college, no student should bring to college any object liable to prove a source of disturbance.
- No mobiles, other books, news papers, periodicals, pictures, games articles, transistors or any electrical instruments not pertaining to their daily use, should be brought to college without the class teacher's / Principal's permission. If detected or found to have bad influence on the fellow students, these will be confiscated and students found guilty may be punished.
- Students are to attend the College in Complete and clean uniform, short and combed hair, clean shaven, polished shoes and trimmed nails.
- Students repeatedly coming late or forgetting to bring books or coming without the proper uniform may be sent home.

Scholarships

It is necessary for the students, who are eligible for the concessions, fellowships, scholarships and stipend sponsored by the institute, to contact the office of the institute and submit their applications within due date. In this regard the students should pay attention to the notices and announcements displayed on the notice board, from time to time. Complete responsibility for submitting the application within the due date lies with the eligible student. Concessions, fellowships, scholarships and stipend are not admissible without application.

Waiver of Tuition Fees :-

This fees waiver can be availed by the student whose (own, parents', or a person on whom he/ she is dependent for his/ her education and living) income is not more than the limit prescribed by the government. To avail this facility, attendance of the student in each trimester should not be less than 75%. If the student's attendance is less than 75% he/ she will have to pay complete fees for that particular trimester in which he/ she falls short of attendance.

For the waiver of fees, the student's parents/guardian or himself/ herself, if major (completed 18 years of age), needs to submit an application to the Director in prescribed format in two copies within 30 days from the date of admission or beginning of the session. Moreover, income certificates duly signed by the gazetted officer or other revenue officer (whose status is not below class III) must be submitted. Merit fees waiver facility is provided to the wards of teachers in primary school. The students can avail following scholarships, fellowships and stipends :

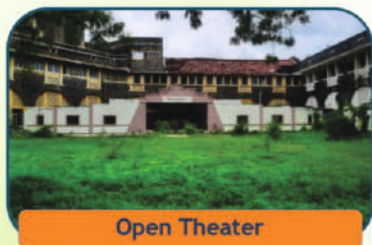

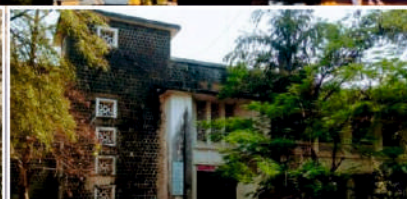
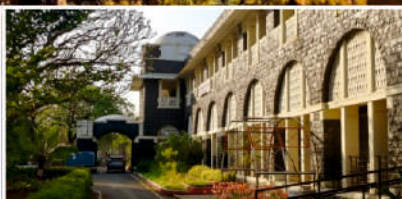
